## CHECKLIST

Jackson Bottom Wetlands Preserve is located 1/2 mile south of downtown Hillsboro along Highway 219. Once, it was a shrubby floodplain used by the Atfalati Indians for hunting small game and gathering roots. Today, the wetlands provide a variety of wildlife habitats and are a seasonal or permanent home to an increasing number of birds, waterfowl and wildlife.

This checklist lists more than 130 species of birds sighted at Jackson Bottom since 1990. Keep a lookout for birds not on this list, as habitat restoration efforts attract new birds, and....
